Chronic kidney disease (CKD) is a type of kidney disease in which there is gradual loss of kidney function over a period of months to years.

Initially there are generally no symptoms; later, symptoms may include leg swelling, feeling tired, vomiting, loss of appetite, and confusion. Complications include an increased risk of heart disease, high

blood pressure, bone disease, and anemia.

Remembering that chronic lung disease can be associated with spurious rheumatoid factor autoantibodies, one must test for serum autoantibodies that are specific to a disease state. Anti-CCP antibodies help to diagnose

rheumatoid arthritis if accompanied by radiographic evidence demonstrating erosive disease and clinical evidence of joint involvement.

Anemia, also spelled anaemia and sometimes called erythrocytopenia, is a decrease in the total amount of red blood cells (RBCs) or hemoglobin in the blood or a lowered ability of the blood to carry oxygen. When anemia comes on slowly, the symptoms are often vague and may

include feeling tired, weakness, shortness of breath, and a poor ability to exercise.

More commonly, kidney failure happens as the final stage of chronic kidney disease. Called 'end stage kidney disease,' this is when about 90% of kidney function has been lost. What are the symptoms of kidney failure? Symptoms of acute kidney failure can include decreased amount of urine, fluid retention,

confusion, nausea and chest pain.

4/3/2020 · A: Kidney disease is diagnosed and tracked using two tests. One is a blood test, called serum creatinine, used to calculate the glomerular filtration rate (GFR), or kidney function, which assesses how well the kidneys are filtering blood. A GFR below 60 for at least 3 months indicates chronic kidney disease.
