Phonics is a method for teaching people how to read and write an

alphabetic language (such as English, Arabic or Russian). It is done by demonstrating the relationship

between the sounds of the spoken language (), and the letters or groups of letters or syllables of the written

language. In English, this is also known as the Alphabetic principle or

the Alphabetic code.

Phonemic Awareness is the awareness of and ability to

manipulate the individual sounds
(phonemes) in spoken words
(Kilpatrick, 2015). Phonemic

awareness is a subset of the broader category of phonological awareness, which is one's conscious awareness

of and ability to “play with” the
sound structures in oral language

(Paulson & Moats, 2010).

Phonological awareness is an essential skill for reading, writing,

listening and talking. Synthetic phonics involves the development of phonemic awareness from the outset.

As part of the decoding process, the reader learns up to 44 phonemes (the smallest units of sound) and their

related graphemes (the written symbols for the phoneme).

and books read in the home.

Targeted phonics interventions may therefore improve decoding skills

more quickly for pupils who have experienced these barriers to learning.
